Tuesday, February 4, 2014, 7:00 p.m.

Call to Order

Mayor Breslin called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

Mayor Breslin said that he would not be seeking reelection as mayor, but would run for a council seat instead. He said he had been offering each councilor the opportunity to manage a council meeting. He gave the gavel to Councilor Stuckey so he could manage the meeting.

Town Clerk Melody Harrison told the council that because Town Administrator Baker was unable to attend the meeting, he asked that Item F, the New Hope Park Follow-Up Discussion, be tabled until the February 18, 2014 council meeting. The council agreed.

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20 **Consider Resolution TC-2014-3 - A Resolution of the New Castle Town Council**
21 **Adopting a Fee Schedule for the Town**

22 Clerk Harrison explained the changes made to the fee schedule as directed by the town
23 council. She noted that some of the liquor fees were set by the state of Colorado liquor
24 code and could not be changed, but that she had changed the ones the town had
25 authority over. Additionally, the business license fees had been eliminated as the council
26 wished. She asked that the council provide some direction regarding that fee, since many
27 businesses had already paid the license fees for 2014. The council felt all businesses that
28 had already paid the license fee for 2014 were eligible for a refund, and that the town
29 should put something in the next town newsletter informing citizens of the fee change.

30 **MOTION: Councilor Riddile made a motion to approve Resolution TC2-2014-3,**

1 Clerk Harrison told the council that because of House Bill 13-1303, mail ballot election law
 2 had changed and provided some complications in conducting mail ballot elections for
 3 municipalities. The county clerk's office had the certifications required by HB13-1303 and
 4 the town staff did not, and the county clerk was willing to conduct the New Castle 2014
 5 election. Clerk Harrison said that both the county clerk and town staff felt that providing
 6 the voters with a mail ballot election was appropriate to maintain the trust and confidence
 7 of the constituents who were comfortable and accustomed to elections being conducted in
 8 this manner. The IGA in the packet outlined the responsibilities of both the County Clerk
 9 and the Town Clerk, and an estimate on the additional cost.

10 **MOTION: Councilor Gordon made a motion to approve the mayor signing an**
 11 **IGA with the Garfield County Clerk and Recorder Regarding the April 8, 2014 Mail**
 12 **Ballot Election. Councilor Riddile seconded the motion and it passed**
 13 **unanimously.**

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 18 **Consider Ordinance TC-2014-1 - An Ordinance of the New Castle Town Council**
 19 **Adopting the Colorado Floodplain Damage Prevention Ordinance (first**
 20 **reading)**

21 Clerk Harrison passed a draft out to the council and explained that the draft had been
 22 modified to include code sections for the New Castle Municipal Code, but that it was all the
 23 exact same information as included in the model ordinance in the packet.

24 Attorney McConaughy told the council there was an optional penalty provision that the
 25 council needed to decide on. Mayor Breslin said he felt the penalty provision should be
 26 included in the ordinance. Councilor Gordon said he thought the ordinance should be
 27 tabled until the next meeting so the council could study the information provided, and
 28 asked if tabling it would cause any complications with the state. Engineer Simonson said
 29 as long as the town was working on the ordinance, they were abiding by the state
 30 request.

31 **MOTION: Councilor Gordon made a motion to table ordinance TC-2014-1, An**
 32 **Ordinance of the New Castle Town Council Adopting the Colorado Floodplain**
 33 **Damage Prevention Ordinance, to the February 18, 2014 council meeting. Mayor**

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Staff Reports

Town Administrator - not present

Town Clerk - Clerk Harrison told the council that supplements for the municipal code books should be arriving soon, and asked the councilors to bring her their codebooks to her for updating. She also said that candidate nomination packets would be available to interested parties on Friday, February 7, 2014.

Town Planner – not present

Council Comments

Councilor Metzger asked how things were going with the Lakota roads. Engineer Simonson said that Bob Gibson with Warrior was looking into less expensive ways to complete the required work. Attorney McConaughy said he had not gotten any response to the letter he sent to Warrior, but he would follow up on the roads issue when he contacted them regarding the recently approved conditional use permit for operation of the golf course.

Councilor Metzger said the Lakota residents were upset that the contractor building a spec house for Warrior was storing construction equipment on the vacant lots adjacent to the new home. She said she understood there were rules in Lakota that prohibited it. Engineer Simonson and Attorney McConaughy said that it could be a provision of the SIA. Councilor Stuckey said there were covenants prohibiting the storage of construction equipment outside the lot lines of the lot being built, but Warrior owned the adjacent lots. Attorney McConaughy said one of the Lakota SIAs spoke to equipment storage and he would look into it.

Councilor Metzger told the council that the Volunteer Picnic will be on Saturday, April 26 and invited everyone to attend.

Mayor Breslin said he had received a letter from a resident on Burning Mountain Avenue complaining about the snow pack on the street there. Clerk Harrison explained that Public Works had addressed the snowpack problem on Burning Mountain Avenue, but that she would follow up with John Wenzel.

Councilor Leland said he thought they should discuss who would attend the BOCC meeting in regard to the proposed trail along CR 335. They agreed that Administrator Baker, Attorney McConaughy, Mayor Breslin, Councilor Gordon and Engineer Simonson would go. Councilor Leland noted for everyone that he was dressed entirely in green because he had lost a super bowl bet with a former student.

Councilor Stuckey asked that Public Works look at curb and gutter on Clubhouse Drive, across from Spirit Way. He said that a private contractor had been plowing snow across Clubhouse and had hit the curb numerous times. He wanted public works to make sure the curbs were not damaged. Clerk Harrison said she would pass the information along to them.

Mayor Breslin told the council that John Colson had been let go from Post Independent and that Heidi Rice was writing for post again. He said she would write about New Castle eliminating the fee for business licenses, as well as the town's new website and efforts to increase economic development. Councilor Leland said there was a picture of New Castle in the daily paper, and Councilor Riddile said news about the trail and pedestrian bridge and the RFTA park and ride should be provided too.
