




<p>ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: One-story, front gable roofed, rectangular building with overhanging eaves and exposed rafters; gabled cupola with overhanging eaves and exposed rafters contains alarm. Walls composed of brick with thick covering of stucco; concrete-covered stone foundation. Upper gable ends clad with narrow lap siding; rear gable has small window opening with hinged wood cover. Facade has paneled and glazed garage door with security grille over window and off-center slab door. Center slab door on south, with segmental arched lintel and transom. Double-hung, 1/1-light windows are tall and narrow, with security grilles. Rear shed roofed addition of stuccoed concrete block. CONSTRUCTION HISTORY (DESCRIPTION, NAMES, DATES, ETC., RELATING TO MAJOR ALTERATIONS TO ORIGINAL STRUCTURE): Roof shape of main part of building was originally flat; gable added later. The cinderblock rear addition was added as a furnace room in the 1960s. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): This building was erected as the town hall and hose house for New Castle in 1893-94. Previously, the town government had operated from various local hotels. The building contained offices for the town clerk and the chambers of the town council, as well as storage space for the fire department equipment. The 1899 Sanborn map indicates that the building housed two independent hose carts, had a belfry 6' above the roof, and a calaboose in the rear. These features are also shown on the 1904 map, and 350' of 2 1/2" hose is also noted. The building now houses an historical museum including displays, historical artifacts, and photographs and archival materials, operated by the New Castle Historical Society.  <div style="text-align: right;">CONTINUED    YES    X    NO</div>
