**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF NEW CASTLE TOWN COUNCIL SUPPORTING
THE APPLICATION FOR A COLORADO PARKS AND WILDLIFE NON-
MOTORIZED TRAILS PLANNING GRANT**

WHEREAS, the Town of New Castle is a municipal political subdivision of the State of Colorado, and therefore an eligible applicant for a non-motorized trails planning grant awarded by the Colorado Department of Parks and Wildlife (CPW) for planning and design of trail facilities for pedestrians, bicyclists, and other non-motorized forms of transportation; and

WHEREAS, the Town of New Castle has submitted a Grant Application for trails planning and design, requesting a total award of \$45,000.00 for trails planning in the Colorado River corridor between South Canyon and Canyon Creek exits, where no trail or alternative path other than the I-70 freeway exists; and

WHEREAS, outdoor recreation is a fundamental component of Colorado's economy and quality of life, and to many Coloradans, outdoor recreation is more than just an activity, but is a lifestyle, and 90 percent of Coloradans participate in some form of outdoor recreation activity every year; and

WHEREAS, the Town of New Castle materially supports outdoor activity, healthy recreation facilities for our residents and visitors, a vital and well connected pedestrian and bicycle trails network, and the economic benefits to our businesses and residents which regional connectivity brings; and

WHEREAS, the Town of New Castle strongly supports regional collaboration and cooperative planning among local and regional entities,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Town of New Castle **THAT:**

1. The above recitals are hereby incorporated as findings by the Town of New Castle.
2. The Town of New Castle strongly supports the 2017 CPW Non-motorized trails planning grant application.
3. If the grant is awarded, the Town of New Castle strongly supports the completion of the trails planning project, and ultimately the design, engineering, and construction of the trail in the Colorado River corridor between Glenwood Springs and New Castle of which the above noted trail section is an integral part.
4. The Town of New Castle authorizes the expenditure of funds necessary to meet the terms and obligations of the grant awarded pursuant to a Grant Agreement with the Colorado Department of Parks and Wildlife; to include appropriation from otherwise unencumbered funds, at least 30%

of the total projected cost of the planning and design project, which may include contributions from other governmental subdivisions, as detailed in the grant application.

5. The project properties will be owned or controlled by the Town of New Castle or its successor regional governmental subdivision for at least 25 years. The Town of New Castle or its successor regional governmental subdivision will continue to operate and maintain the properties in a high quality condition.

6. If the grant is awarded, the Town of New Castle hereby authorizes the Mayor to sign a Grant Agreement with the Colorado Department of Parks and Wildlife and such ancillary agreements which shall be necessary to complete the grant award process.
